Full Day Camp (Entering Grades 3–8)

Entering Grades 3–8: Students benefit by participating in all three IMACS summer academic programs: Logic Puzzles, Computer Programming & Virtual Robotics, and Electronics. Students are totally immersed in fun-filled academic pursuits such as playing strategic logic games, designing and building electronic devices, and programming computers. (See the next page for course descriptions.)

Time: Full Day Camp: 8:30 – 3:30 (*North Raleigh and Chapel Hill*) 9:00 – 4:00 (*Cary*)
Lunch: 12:45 – 1:30 (*North Raleigh and Chapel Hill*) 12:00 – 1:00 (*Cary*)

There are small breaks within each class and between classes.

Cost: \$388. (Cary campers must add a \$7 facility fee.)

Individual Classes (Entering Grades 1–12)

North Raleigh and Chapel Hill: students may enroll in individual classes. Each class meets Monday through Friday for two hours each day (except for students entering grades 1 or 2). See the next page for more details.

Cary: Campers may register for half-day camps. See the forms provided by Cary Academy for more details.

- ✓ Each session is one week in length. Classes are Monday through Friday.
- ✓ You choose the weeks you want. They do not need to be consecutive. New students are welcome each week.
- ✓ No registration fee. No supply fee.
- ✓ A Full Day student should bring lunch in a cold pack. Snacks and drinks are available for \$0.75 each.
- ✓ For students starting at 8:30, early drop off is available at 8:00 at no charge. (For information on late pick-up, see the next page.)
- ✓ "Beforecare" and "Aftercare" are available. (For more information: North Raleigh and Chapel Hill parents can go to Page 2 of this form; Cary parents can look in the forms provided by Cary Academy.)

Discounts

- ✓ An *Early Tuition Discount* (10% off of the regular price) is available for North Raleigh campers when the balance is paid in full by April 23, 2012.
- ✓ A *Multiple Class Discount* (10% off the lower class price) is available for each North Raleigh camper who is enrolled in more than one individual class in the same week.
- ✓ A *Sibling Discount* (10% off the lower price) is available for a family that enrolls more than one child in the same session at the North Raleigh location.

Summer Camp 2012: Individual Class Descriptions

Logic Puzzles (Entering Grades 1–8)

[Course Code: LP]

Entering Grades 1–2: Games! Puzzles! Fun! (But don't tell your kids that they are learning how to reason and are developing a love of mathematical thinking.)

Entering Grades 3–8: Mysteries of pure logic are presented in fun, compelling stories. Painstakingly designed, this class leads students from elementary deductive reasoning to skills that exceed those of most college graduates! Team logic games, exciting tournaments, and, as in every IMACS class, new challenges each week!

Time: Grades 1–2 at Raleigh: 4:00pm – 5:30pm
Grades 1–2 at Chapel Hill (1) and Chapel Hill (2): 1:45pm – 3:15pm
Grades 3–4: 8:30am – 10:30am
Grades 5–6: 1:30pm – 3:30pm
Grades 7–8: 10:45am – 12:45pm

Cost: Grades 1–2 \$129.
Grades 3–8 \$159.

Computer Programming & Virtual Robotics (Entering Grades 3–9)

[Course Code: CE]

Students don't merely use the computer in this course. They write computer programs! Using the programming language LOGO, developed at MIT, students are challenged by projects designed by the IMACS Curriculum Development Group. With individualized guidance, students develop basic programming and problem-solving skills. Students can also apply these skills in the IMACS Virtual Robotics Lab, where programmable, configurable robots exist in a virtual world that contains the physical realities of friction, acceleration, and conservation of momentum.

Time: Three time slots available: 8:30am – 10:30am; 10:45am – 12:45pm; 1:30pm – 3:30pm

Cost: \$179.

Electronics (Entering Grades 3–10)

[Course Code: EE]

These classes introduce students to the fascinating world of electronics. Students learn about electrical components such as resistors, diodes, LEDs, capacitors, transistors and integrated circuits, and use them to design and construct fun projects. Courses are tailored according to age and ability so that each student is able to advance as far as his or her interests and abilities allow. Students may keep the electronic devices that they build.

Time: Three time slots available: 8:30am – 10:30am; 10:45am – 12:45pm; 1:30pm – 3:30pm

Cost: \$199.

Computer Science (Entering Grades 7–12)

[Course Code: CS]

Students pursue an academic, university-level, computer science course. The IMACS curriculum has been used in prestigious programs such as Duke University's Talent Identification Program and Johns Hopkins University's Center for Talented Youth. Students work with interactive tools available only at IMACS and are taught by highly qualified and trained professionals. This class goes well beyond a traditional introductory course, introducing advanced concepts such as recursion, functional programming, object-oriented programming, and artificial intelligence. Contact IMACS to find out if this class is appropriate for your child.

Time: Three time slots available: 8:30am – 10:30am; 10:45am – 12:45pm; 1:30pm – 3:30pm

Cost: \$199.



Summer Camp 2012: Aftercare

North Raleigh and Chapel Hill: Full day campers attend IMACS from 8:30am to 3:30pm. From 3:30pm to 5:00pm, an "aftercare" service is available. The cost is \$8 per day. Parents of students not enrolled in aftercare who fail to pick up their child(ren) by 3:45pm will be charged a \$8.00 aftercare fee (for each such day). Any aftercare camper left after 5:15pm will be charged a late fee of \$1.00 per minute. Please see the back page (Policies and Procedures) for additional information. Early drop-off is available from 8:00am to 8:30am (for full day campers) at no additional charge.

Summer Camp 2012: Policies and Procedures

Admissions IMACS accepts students based on their talents and abilities and does not discriminate on the basis of sex, race, nationality, ethnic origin, or other irrelevant criteria.

Media Release IMACS may take photographs or video of any child participating in summer camp activities, and may use these images for marketing purposes. No compensation will be made for the use of these images.

Tuition, Payments and Refunds Enrollment is on a first-come, first-served basis. Students must pay a non-refundable deposit to reserve their place. The balance is due before June 1, 2012. If payment in full is not made by this date, camper enrollment may be subject to cancellation at the discretion of the camp director. New registrations after May 31, 2012, must be accompanied by a payment in full. A portion of the tuition (\$100 per full-day session and \$75 per individual program) is a non-refundable deposit and will not be returned for any reason. A full refund less the deposit will be given up until May 31, 2012. After May 31, 2012, tuition is forfeited and may be transferable subject to availability. If camp weeks are cancelled with less than 2 full weeks notice, the weeks will NOT be transferable. If unforeseen conditions, including, but not limited to, hurricanes, power outages, and epidemics, cause IMACS to shut down its summer camp for any length of time, no tuition will be refunded, credited, and transferred.

Discounts Early tuition discounts of 10% are available to North Raleigh campers who register and pay the tuition in full before April 23, 2012. Multiple class and sibling discounts of 10% are available for any full day and individual programs within each session at the North Raleigh location.

Conduct and Discipline Students are expected to conduct themselves in an orderly manner and to treat those working around them with respect. Students whose behavior is disruptive to the class will be removed from the classroom, and their parents will be notified. The directors reserve the right, at their sole discretion, to withdraw any camper whose influence or actions are deemed unsatisfactory or detrimental to the camp or who will not abide by the camp rules and policies. If this occurs, no reduction or return of fee, or any part thereof, will be made.

Attendance Students should make every attempt to attend all classes. IMACS does not offer summer make-up classes.

Pickup Procedures It is essential that a parent or other authorized adult pick up students when classes are over. Single class campers should be picked up inside the building by a parent.

North Raleigh and Chapel Hill: Full-day campers will assemble after class, at 3:35, and walk with instructors to the front of the school to meet the parents. If a child's parents are not there, the child will come back inside and wait in the after-care room. In this case, it will be the parent's responsibility to come into the building to pick up the child. Parents who fail to pick up their children within fifteen minutes of the end of their individual class are considered late and will be charged a \$8.00 fee unless a previous arrangement has been made with the IMACS staff. In case of emergencies or other situations over which parents have little control, parents should try to telephone IMACS in order to alert the staff. Extended day care ("aftercare") is available until 5:00pm. Parents of full day students not enrolled in aftercare who fail to pick up their child by 3:45pm will be charged the \$8.00 daily aftercare fee. Any aftercare camper left after 5:15pm will be charged a late fee of \$1.00 per minute. When filling out the course selection area, be sure to indicate whether you need to purchase aftercare. **If an adult other than a parent is to pick up a student, IMACS staff must be notified prior to the pick-up. We require written parental permission to allow a child to leave the building without supervision (i.e. to walk home or out to the car by him/herself).**

Cary: Campers and parents must follow the pickup and drop-off procedures outlined in the forms provided by Cary Academy.

First Aid & Medications It is the responsibility of parents to provide IMACS with emergency phone numbers and instructions. IMACS staff are not allowed to administer first aid or to dispense over-the-counter medications to any student without express prior written permission of parents. A first aid kit is available for any student requiring an antiseptic or Band-Aid. All possible precautions are taken to ensure that the activities at IMACS Summer Camp are conducted in a safe and responsible manner. However, because of the nature of some of the activities, regardless of the high degree of supervision, there is a potential for accidental injury. Parents agree to assume these risks and to release IMACS, its officers, directors, employees and agents from, hold them harmless from and waive any claim against IMACS as to any injury that may occur to their child(ren) while attending IMACS Summer Camp.

Lunch & Snacks Students should bring lunch in a cold pack. Snacks and drinks are available for purchase at IMACS for \$0.75 each. Students may also bring their own snacks. At some locations, G or PG movies may be shown during the lunch break. Your signature below verifies that you permit your child to watch these movies.
